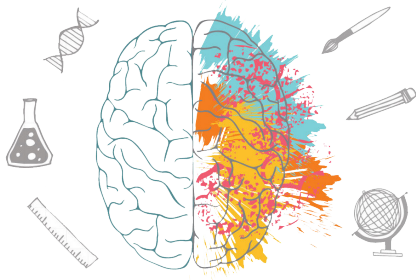


Is architecture + design for you?

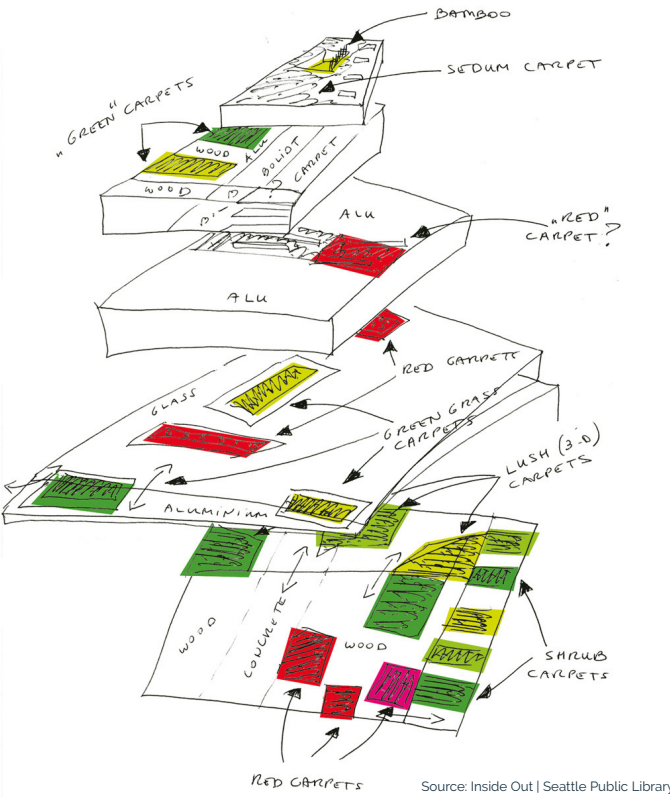


Do You Want to Be an Architect or an Interior Designer?

What is architecture + interior design?

The Royal Architectural Institute of Canada defines the practice of **architecture** as:

“The practice of architecture consists of the provision of professional services in connection w/ town planning as well as the design, construction, enlargement, conservation, restoration, or alteration of a building or group of buildings.”



CIDQ defines **interior design** as:

“Interior design encompasses the analysis, planning, design, documentation, + management of interior non-structural/non-seismic construction + alteration projects in compliance w/applicable building design + construction, fire, life-safety, + energy codes, standards, regulations, + guidelines for the purpose of obtaining a building permit, as allowed by law.”

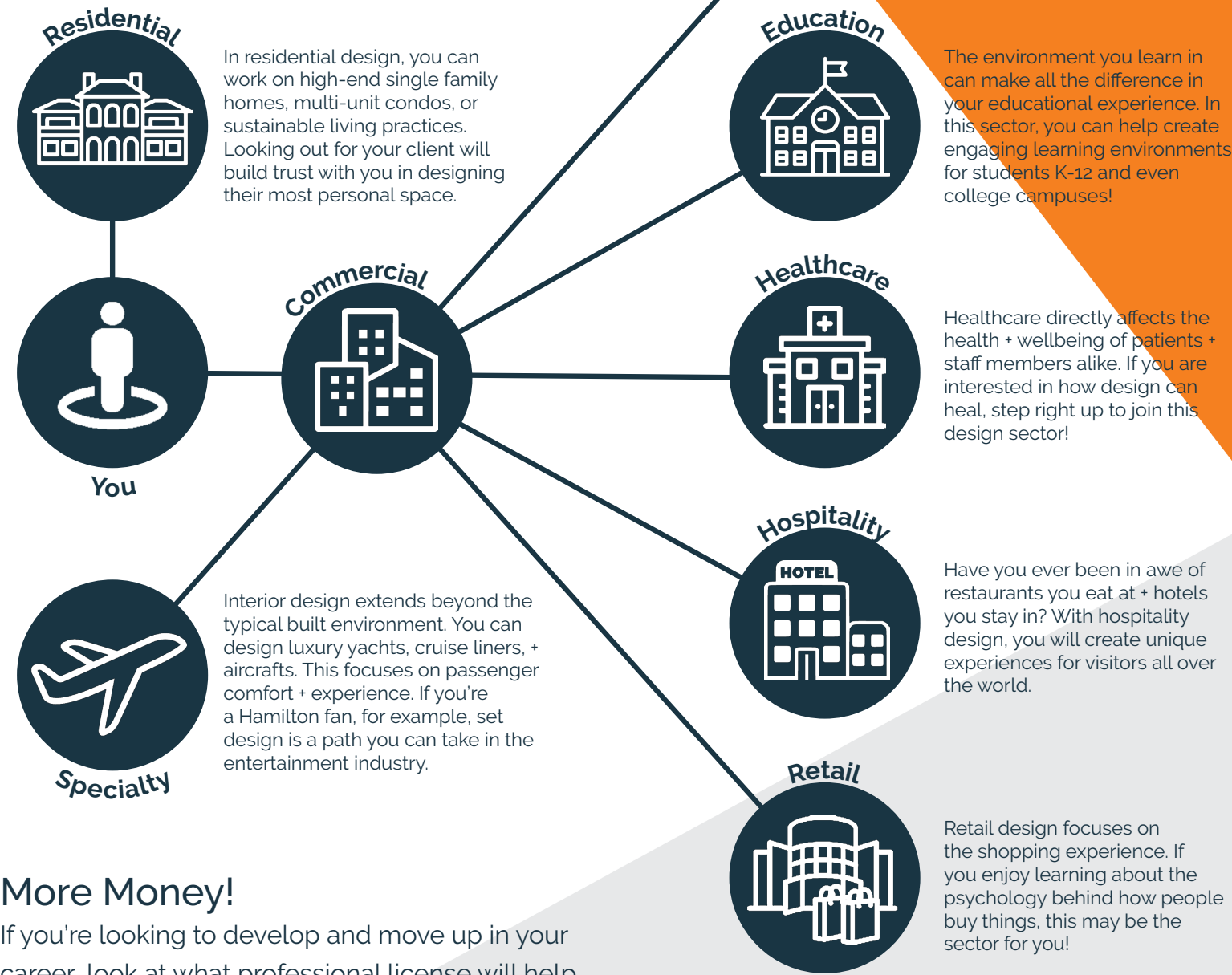
Setting yourself up for success...

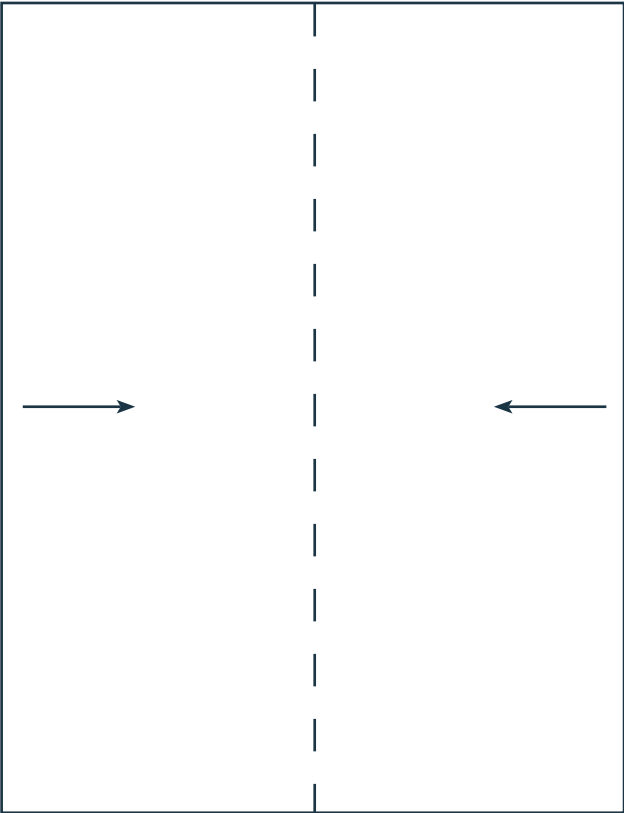
